HOW WE STARTED ?

Integrated Development Society (IDS) is a secular, non-political and non-profit making social development organization. It started as a Civil Society Organization in 1990 with the backing up of Save the Children Fund (UK), Koraput District Administration and community people to address the issues of Children in the drought hit tribal/poor rural villages of Dasamantapur Block in Koraput District. IDS got itself registered under Societies Registration Act of 1860 and also with the Ministry of Home, Govt. of India under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act of 1976. After the withdrawal of SCF (UK) in 1997, the Organisation is being managed by a group of local committed people assisted by a group of professionals.

WHERE WE WORK... ..

The present major intervention area of IDS is Koraput District in general and Dasamantapur Block in particular of South Odisha which forms a part of the central plateau of Eastern Ghats in the East coast of India. The Block is considered as one of the most backward, remote and neglected Block in the state. According to the Planning Commission, Government of India and Ghadei Committee Report of Government of Odisha, Dasamantapur comes under the category of very backward Blocks and occupies 14th position in backwardness among 314 CD Blocks of Odisha. It has drawn the attention of the media several times both nationally and internationally due to recurring drought and starvation death. Dasamantapur is a scheduled area as per the constitution of India and covers indigenous tribes like, Jhodia Paraja, Kondha, and Gond etc.

THE PEOPLE WE SERVE... ..

The People and the target groups with whom IDS has been working are pre-dominantly tribal and Scheduled Caste. [About 65% ST (Paraja & Kondha tribes), 10% SC and 25% other backward people & out of total households in the area, about 90% fall below the Govt. Defined poverty line]. We mainly focus on these groups as they are most vulnerable, marginalized, illiterate and ignorant. The literacy rate of the people is extremely low as compared to regional average with only 67 % in general and females 47 % of the Block (ST=Male 31%, Female 29%, SC= Male 32%,Female 31%) (As per 2011 Census). This part of South Orissa is considered the place of most poor people in the entire South Asia. This is the reason, the Govt. of India has declared this region as most neglected area under the KBK program (KBK area, as per the name of 3 most neglected and underdeveloped district, i.e. Koraput, Balangir and Kalahandi in the state.) for special assistance through mobilizing resources from different sources.

Mission Statement:

To facilitate the development of a "new social order " in which the present unorganized and marginalized people have a say in the decision making, where education creates awareness, develops skills and fosters the growth of men and women, totally liberated from all dehumanizing and oppressive forces, and where the decisions of the individuals, communities and Societies are based on the values of social justice, equity, truth, freedom and the dignity of human life, IDS's entire philosophy is based on the values of non-discrimination, equality, non-violence and the eradication of poverty, illiteracy and inequality. It works primarily with tribals, dalits and other indigenous people.

Vision:

We seek a world of hope, tolerance and social justice where every woman, men & child has right to development and poverty has been overcome and people live with peace, dignity and security.

Strategic Areas of Intervention

Health, Education & Livelihood with particular focus on Tribals, Dalits & Marginalized sections of the community.

Major Activities in brief

- Promoting and strengthening community level institutions and linking them with financial and technical institutions of both government and non government agencies for livelihood improvement.*
- Providing Technical services/skill development training to the communities for improving their traditional as well as alternative livelihood.*
- Empowering community to establish linkages with various government social safety net (Social security) program for different vulnerable groups like poor, women, children, old and physically challenged etc.*
- Providing health services to the poor and vulnerable communities residing in the inaccessible areas.*
- Support the basic needs of the most disadvantages & vulnerable children more particularly those who have been denied to their basic rights like food, health and education due to socio cultural and economic problems of the community.*
- Adoption of Orphan, abandoned & surrender children as per the guideline of CARA-Govt. of India*

CARE & SUPPORT SERVICES FOR THE DISADVANTAGES CHILDREN THROUGH CHILD CARE INSTITUTION

IDS has identified a number of most needy, disadvantaged/vulnerable children in the area particularly those who have been denied to their basic rights like food, health and education. IDS with the support of Shared Blessings-USA is supporting to 40 numbers of such category of tribal & Scheduled caste children during the year those who are either parentless or have lost one of the parents and are in a state of impoverished conditions.

Support is being given for catering to their basic minimum needs of health, education and nutrition. IDS is committed to take this program forward and to expand it for the best interest of the children in this poverty stricken area. In order to ensure quality education and to bring all children under proper schooling and education, a residential School namely **"ADARSH GIRIJAN PRAGATI**

VIDYALAYA" has been established in the Block Headquarters of Dasamantapur. Presently this school is working as Child Care Institutions where the children are staying with boarding facilities (This CCI is legally approved by Women and Child Development Deptt, Govt. of Odisha) and they are being provided with quality education, nutritious food & dress materials for leading a disciplined and meaningful life. Necessary efforts are being made for the improvement of their physical, mental and moral growth of the children.



Children covered:

Integrated Development Society (IDS) is running a Child Care Institution (CCI) in Dasamantapur block of Koraput district in Odisha under W & CD department. As per the order of district Child Welfare Committee & under Juvenile Justice Act of INDIA, orphan and abandoned and surrendered children are staying in CCI-IDS. The Children admitted in this CCI are most vulnerable orphan, abandoned and surrendered children (Scheduled tribes and Scheduled castes and from the pool of extremely helpless and destitute category). Presently, we have the capacity 50 Children and all are staying with Lodging & boarding facilities in the school/CCI.

The progress made during the period

Educational Status of children:- Educational Status of

children:- For right to education to every child, all of our CCI children have been admitted in different class in Govt. School so that no child has been deprived of education. During the educational session 2022-2023 almost 46 no. of children are continuing their study in Govt. schools and 10 no. of children are continuing in ITI

study in Govt. college and 2 no. of children have completed their ITI. As per the report, about 8 no. of children are studying class 10th, 2 no. of children are studying in class 9th in Govt. High School, Dasamantapur. While, 4 no. of children are studying in class 8th, 4 no. of children are studying in class 7th, 6 no. of children are studying in class 6th at Upper Primary School Dasamantapur, 3 no. of children are studying in class 5th, 4 no. of children are studying in class 4th, 1 no. of children are studying class 3rd, 6 no. of children are studying class 2nd at Govt. Primary School,



Dasamantapur and 4 no. of children are studying in class 1st. Special coaching classes are also being arranged in morning and evening hours to the elder children who are admitted in formal schools to sharpen their skills & knowledge. All types of support are being provided to children to facilitate their study and for a better living standard.



During the year 2022-23, Sixteen no. of children (8 boys and 8 girls) have successfully completed their ITI in different trade and after successfully completion their course, now they are doing private jobs locally. All girls have got offer to go outside state if they get better opportunity.

Providing basic amenities and aids to the age appropriate children:

- ✚ Different materials (teaching & learning aid/hygiene kit/shoe/bags/dresses/Tiffin Boxes & eating utensils) have been provided to the children as per the requirement to the age appropriate children. Besides iron cot with proper bedding arrangement is provided to each children ensuring the cleanliness and hygiene without any compromise. During the reporting period, dry ration (Rice, Dal ,flattened rice ,sugar, soap, biscuit, Mask, hand sanitizer) was supplied to the children & their families during this crises lock down period .



Food for children Nutritious food intake is given high priority as it contributes a lot in the growth of a child physically and mentally as well. So breakfast, lunch, afternoon Tiffin and dinner are the routine food arrangement consisting of both vegetarian and non-vegetarian items.



Ensuring health and Hygiene services within the reach of the children:

- ❖ Health is important for all children ,so we pray god for good health for all child and provide different type of support to improve their health condition . Regular monthly health check-up of the children is being done by the experienced physicians and medicines as prescribed by the doctor are being given. The first aid box is kept inside the campus and is used in case of minor health ailments/emergency. The serious cases as referred by the CHC doctor are taken to DHH-Koraput for better health services .
- ❖ In order to make the body and mind fit, all children are practicing YOGA every day. All children are drinking purified water through the water purifier machine. Iron cot with proper bedding arrangement has also been provided to each child and initiative is being taken for ensuring cleanliness and hygiene of the children.
- ✚ During the reporting period all children are practicing hand wash and maintaining health & hygiene as per the advice of the doctor.
- ✚ As per the instruction of the district administration regular sanitizing is being done in the AGPV premises with bleaching powder and phenyl.

from the books. All books subject wise have been arranged systematically in the iron rack. All children are getting



maximum benefit from the library by using their free

time. Small children are enjoying the reading with books in pictorial form.

- Efforts are being made to make the library more systematic and functional, so that children will be able to make use of the library in its fullest extent.

Support by LIC Golden Jubilee Foundation

With the kind support of LIC Golden Jubilee Foundation-Mumbai, the construction of the building “ Skill Development Training Centre for the Tribal Youth” is going on. It is expected to complete the building buy the end of 2024. A number of local tribal youth will get benefit through this project trogh receiving various kind of Training Programme.



Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA)

With the support of Women & Child Development Department-Govt. of Odisha, two Specialized Adoption Agency (SAAs) are being implemented by IDS in Koraput & Rayagada District Headquarters covering both Districts,. Initiative has been taken to provide preventive, protective and rehabilitative services for the children who are totally orphan, abandoned and surrendered. During this financial year, 13no of orphan children those who are deprived of early parental care and away from social mainstream are admitted in the Specialised Adoption Agency (SAA) and other CCIs and they are being provided with all sorts of institutional care (food, clothing, education, recreation, health check-up etc.). During the period, 4 children have been given in Pre-adoption Foster care/adoption to the suitable Prospective Adoptive Parents (In country Adoption-4). Attempt is being made to provide suitable home/parents through both in-country and inter country adoption as per the norm/guidelines of CARA/Govt. of India.

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Other Activities and Management

Working with Self Help Groups (SHGs):

250 Women Self Help Groups have been promoted in the IDS operational area covering 7 GPs and 106 villages of Dasamantapur Block. All these SHGs have been instrumental for undertaking various community based development programmes in a sustainable manner. SHGs



themselves also contribute resources in the management of SHGs, record keeping,



regular meeting, savings and liaison with the financial institutions for credit linkages. Initiative has also been taken to involve the SHGs in carrying out successful income generation activities to improve their livelihood. All the 250

SHGs promoted by IDS have been greatly benefited by this endeavor.

Collaboration and liaison with Government:

IDS has an excellent rapport and understanding with the district / local administration and NGOs of the area as well. The staff IDS, by liaising with the district and block administration identify people with needs and has linked them to various benefits of government such as safety-net programme, Indira Awas yojana, Janani Surakshy Yojana, Annapurna Jojana, Antodaya Jojana, old age pensions and widow pensions, etc. The good relationship of IDS with the district and Block Administration has supported in getting cooperation from the various line departments of government such as Health, Panchayat Raj, Women and Children, Rural Development, Horticulture, Agriculture and Education Departments etc. to work in a collaborative approach. This has also helped even the members of the IDS developed village groups by which with confidence, they are meeting the officials to get their work done.
