Background

The Integrated Development Society (IDS) is a secular, non-political and non-profit making voluntary development organisation. It started as a Civil Society Organisation in 1990 by the Save the Children Fund (UK), Koraput District Administration and community people to address the issues of Children in the drought hit tribal/ poor rural villages of Dasamantapur Block in Koraput District. IDS got itself registered under Societies Registration Act of 1860 and also with the Ministry of Home, Govt. of India under foreign Contribution Regulation Act of 1976. After the withdrawal of SCF (UK) in 1997, now the Organisation is being managed by a group of local committed people assisted by a group of professionals. Now the operational area of IDS is undivided Koraput Dist. But most of our field programme is at Dasamantapur Block in Koraput District.

PROFILE OF THE AREA

The present major intervention area of IDS is Koraput District in general and Dasamantapur Block in particular of South Orissa which forms a part of the central plateau of Eastern Ghats in the East coast of India. The Block is considered as one of the most backward, remote and neglected Block in the state. According to the Planning Commission, Government. of India and Ghadei Committee Report of Government. of Orissa, Dasamantapur comes under the category of very backward Blocks and occupies 14th position in backwardness among 314 CD Blocks of Orissa. It has drawn the attention of the press several times both nationally and internationally due to recurring drought and starvation death. Dasamantapur is a scheduled area as per the constitution of India and covers indigenous tribes like, Jhodia Paraja, Kondha, and Gond etc.

A characteristic feature is the predominance of poor families/persons with more than **70% of the population being classified as Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe**. Farm laborer and non-workers comprise 80% of the total population indicating high dependency on limited family income. With the absence of basic facilities like road, electricity, primary health care & education, people suffer a lot & the area presents a picture of neglect although vast land and human labor potentialities exist in greater extent unutilized.

IDS has been working in this area since last 30 years giving priority broadly on Health, Education and Agriculture Sector.(mainly on food security, land based activity and capacity building of women, children and mother and Child health aspects as well)

Description of the target groups

The designated project area presents a unique problems of degraded forest, extremely low yield, absence of basic facilities like primary health care and education, limited opportunities of gainful employment and predominance of poor persons (**out of the total persons, 90% fall below the Govt. defined poverty line**). Existing land use varies with limited forest cover and absence of irrigation facilities even if perennial source of water is in proximity. The entire cultivated area receives scarce and uncertain rainfall, creating drought conditions towards the end of kharif season. A characteristic feature is the predominance of poor families/persons with nearly 73% of the population being classified as SC/ST (ST=62.8% & SC=10.5% as per 2011 Census) The literacy rate is extremely low as compared to regional average with only 41.71% in general (Male-44.81% and female is 24.57)as per 2011 census of the Block. Farm laborer and non-workers comprise 80% of the total population indicating high dependency on limited family income. With the absence of basic facilities like road, electricity, primary health care and education, project area presents a picture of neglect although vast land and human labor potentialities exist in greater extent unutilized. **This area/Koraput district comes as one of the aspiration district** (

Out of 124 district in India) identified by NITI AYO- Govt. of India in 2018

This part of South Orissa is considered the place of most poor people in the entire South Asia. This is the reason, the Govt. of India has declared this region as most neglected area under the KBK program (KBK area, as per the name of 3 most neglected and underdeveloped district, i.e. Koraput ,Balangir and Kalahandi in the state.) for special assistance through mobilizing resources from different sources.

Mission Statement

The over all aim of IDS is to facilitate the development of a “new social order “ in which the present unorganized and marginalized people have a say in the decision making, where education creates awareness, develops skills and fosters the growth of men and women, totally liberated from all dehumanizing and oppressive forces, and where the decisions of the individuals, communities and Societies are based on the values of social justice, equity, truth, freedom and the dignity of human life, IDS’s entire philosophy is based on the values of non-discrimination, equality, non-violence and the eradication of poverty, illiteracy and inequality. It works primarily with tribals ,dalits and other indigenous people.

Vision

We seek a world of hope, tolerance and social justice where every child , women, men has right to development and poverty has been overcome and people live with dignity and security.

Objectives :

- * To develop the capacity of tribal and marginalised communities through long-term, sustainable approaches which will ensure their rights and socio economic development.
- * To develop a social organizational base among the tribal and dalits in the area and establish linkages with appropriate state level recognized bodies on issues affecting their future and help them develop lobbying and advocacy on the same.
- * Undertake various income generation and skill development program for the tribal and marginalized people in order to provide a sustainable livelihood in the long run specifically orphan children.

Strategic Area of Intervention:- Health, Education & Livelihood with particular focused on Tribals, Dalits & Marginalized sections of the community.

Activities in brief:-

- *Promoting and strengthening community level institutions and linking them with financial and technical institutions of both government and non government agencies for livelihood improvement.*
- *Providing Technical services/skill development training to the communities for improving their traditional as well as alternative livelihood.*
- *Empowering community to establish linkages with various government social safety net (Social security) program for different vulnerable groups like poor, women, children, old and physically challenged etc.*
- *Providing health services to the poor and vulnerable communities residing in the inaccessible areas.*

- *Support the basic needs of the most disadvantages & vulnerable children more particularly those who have been denied to their basic rights like food, health and education due to socio cultural and economic problems of the community.*
- *Promoting livelihood of the marginalized people through right based approach.*
- *Community Based Rehabilitation for the physically challenged people.*
- Promoting adoption of Orphan, abandoned & surrendered children (both in country & inter country adoption.) as per the Govt. of India guidelines.
- Carrying out action research on prevalence of Orphan children and alternative community rehabilitation in the project area.
- Strategic counselling to orphan children on life skill education and career building for restoring them into community main stream

As we have a good relation with the local Dist. and Block Administration, we used to get cooperation from the various Govt. line departments, such as Health, Panchayat Raj, Women and Children, Rural Development, Horticulture, Agriculture and Education Department etc. It has also helped the members of the Peoples Organisation to build up their confidence in meeting the Govt. People and to get their work done.

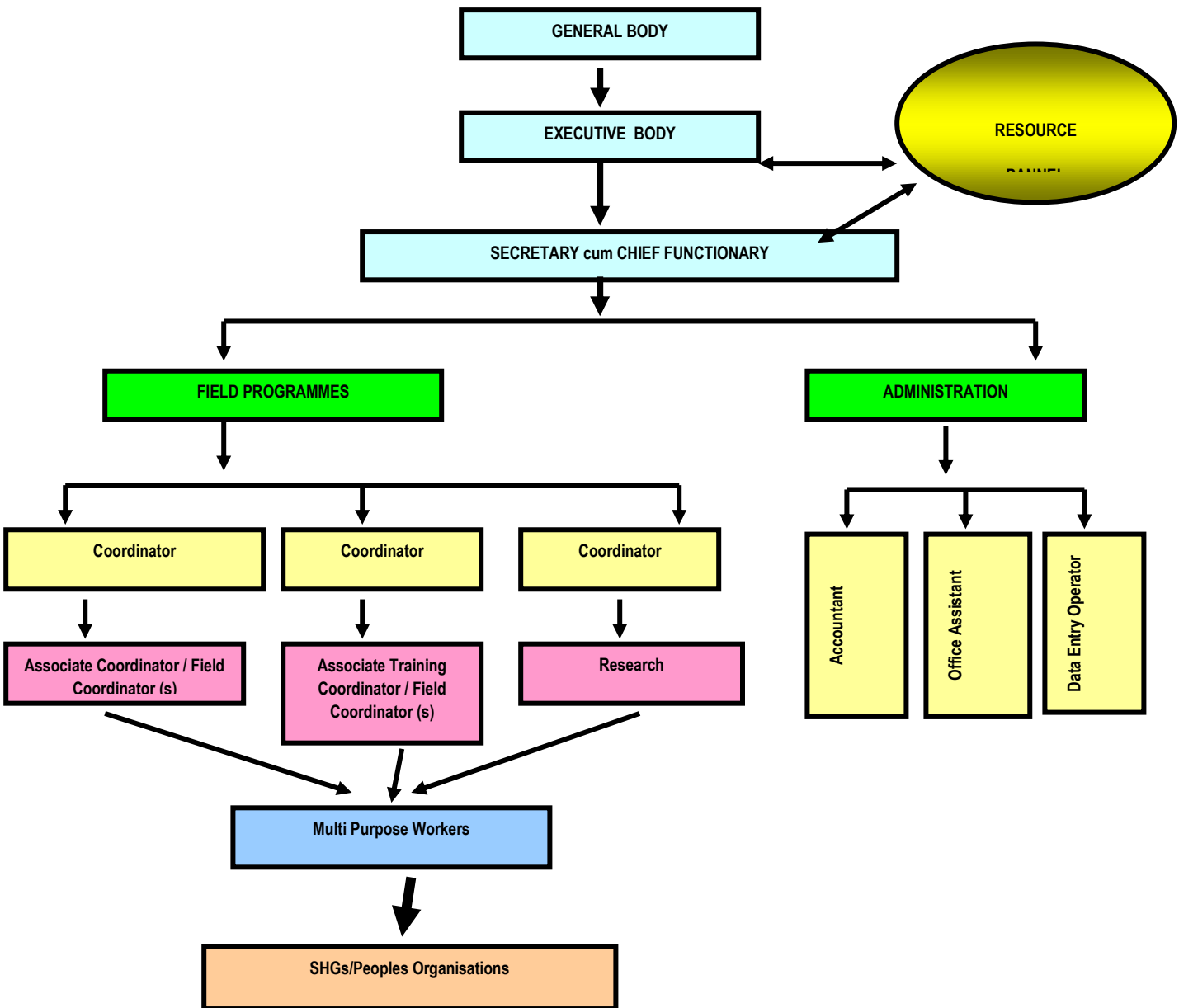
